GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENT	Fulfills Arts Requirement Goal Six: To understand aesthetic values, the creative process, and the interconnectedness of the literary, visual, and performing arts throughout the history of civilization. To achieve this goal, student should: 1. Participate in and/ or observe a variety of artistic expression; 2. Study the discipline and techniques involved in artistic creations; 3. Understand how and why people use artistic form.				

COURSE GOAL

The goal of applied study is to assist the student in discovering and understanding the skills necessary to help develop his/her individual playing abilities on the clarinet. Included is an in-depth study of 1) technical developments 2) solo literature and 3) pedagogical techniques appropriate both for the music and the instrument. All professional musicians teach applied lessons sometime during their career. Thorough study in these three areas helps develop the student's skills both as a performer and as a teacher.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon completion of 212Q, students will be able to demonstrate development of initial technical skills by successfully performing:

- Scales: Chromatic Scales (to high A), Natural minor Scales and Arpeggios (quarter equals 112)
- Technical Studies: 6 or more keys in Foundation Studies
- Etudes: 5 or more Etudes from Rose or Hite
- Solos: 2 or more works or movements from the appropriate level literature
- Excerpts: 2 or more excerpts from the appropriate level literature

COURSE REQUIERMENTS

The grade earned in applied music is based on a student's efforts and measured by his/her musical growth over a semester. Careful observation will be given to the quality and quantity of work performed throughout the entire semester, not just the last few lessons prior to a jury. Percentages of the final grade will be based on the following:

I. WEEKLY PREPARATION	40%
Each student will be given a preparation grade each week based on the criteria below. Students may ask to see their weekly preparation grades at any time.	
1. QUALITY AND CONSISTENCY OF PREPARATION	
Work out, on your own, the most difficult passages to the best of your ability. A private lesson is not a practice hour. It is the opportunity to learn new applications for rehearsal in the practice room.	
2. CONSISTENCY OF PROGRESS	
The better you become, the more slowly you improve. You must practice daily with set goals and develop the maturity to work your way through each one.	
DEMONSTRATION OF A MATURE, PROFESSIONAL ATTITUDE	
a. Warm up before lessons, not during them.	
c. Be Prepared, order any sheet music immediately upon assignment. It is the required text(s) for this course. Photocopying is illegal and an insult to our fellow musicians who compose.	
d. Discover questions in the practice room and bring them to lessons.
